

provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1968, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 178 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1962 within 6 weeks from 16th July 1970 make application for the purpose to the High Court.

#### NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1968

#### SECTION 94

*The Worthing Rural District Council Part of Public Footpath No. 2115 at East Preston, Diversion Order, 1970.*

Notice is hereby given that the above named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 14th July 1970, is about to be confirmed by the Worthing Rural District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert part of public footpath No. 2115 at East Preston which part begins at the eastern end of St. Mary's Drive and runs at an undefined width southwards for approximately 50 feet and continues for approximately 110 feet south-eastwards to the junction with public footpath No. 2114 to a line commencing at a point which begins at the eastern end of St. Mary's Drive and runs eastwards at a minimum width of 6 feet for approximately 70 feet and thence southwards at a minimum width of 6 feet for approximately 100 feet to the junction with public footpath No. 2114.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Worthing Rural District Council, 15 Mill Road, Worthing, Sussex, between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Worthing Rural District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Minister for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Minister with the Order.

*Ascertainment of footpaths, bridleways and certain  
other highways—Provisional Map and Statement*

Notice is hereby given that in accordance with section 30 (1) of the above-mentioned Act, the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire have prepared a Provisional Map and Statement of public rights of way (footpaths, bridleways and roads used as public paths) within the areas of the Boroughs

of Keighley and Pudsey, the Urban Districts of Aireborough, Baildon, Barnoldswick, Bingley, Earby, Horsforth, Ilkley, Otley, Shipley, Silsden and Skipton, the Rural Districts of Bowland and Wharfedale, and the following Parishes in the Rural Districts of Settle and Skipton: (Settle Rural District) Bentham, Burton in Lonsdale, Halton West, Nappa, Rathmell, Swinden and Wigglesworth; (Skipton Rural District) Addingham, Bank Newton, Bracewell, Bradleys Both, Brogden, Broughton, Carleton, Coniston Cold, Cononley, Cowling, Draughton, Elslack, Farnhill, Glusburn, Kildwick, Lothersdale, Martons Both, Salterforth, Steeton with Eastburn, Sutton and Thornton in Craven.

The Provisional Map and Statement annexed thereto for the areas of the above-mentioned County Districts and Parishes have been deposited for public inspection free of charge at the offices of the County Engineer and Surveyor, 17 Burton Street, Wakefield, any may be seen there until the 19th day of August, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 5.20 p.m. on each week-day (other than Saturday).

During the same period copies of the map so far as the same relate to each of the County Districts affected will be on deposit and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the respective Council Offices:

Copies of the map so far as the same relate to the Rural Districts of Bowland, Skipton and Wharfedale will also be on deposit during the same period from Monday to Friday inclusive, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. at the following places:

*Bowland Rural District.* Police Station, Gisburn.

*Skipton Rural District.* Offices of James Laycock and Sons, Joiners and Merchants, Cononley.

*Wharfedale Rural District.* The Security Office, Messrs. B. S. and W. Whiteley Ltd., The Paper Mills, Pool in Wharfedale.

Copies of the Statement so far as the same relates to the Rural Parishes in the County Districts affected will wherever practicable be on deposit in each Parish during the same period for public inspection. Particulars as to where such copies may be inspected in Rural Parishes will be supplied by the County Engineer and Surveyor, County Hall, Wakefield on request.

At any time within 28 days from the date of this notice the owner, lessee or occupier of any land shown on the map to which this notice relates, being land on which the map shows a public path, or a road used as a public path, may apply to Quarter Sessions for a declaration in accordance with Section 31 (1) of the Act:

- (a) that at the relevant date mentioned in the Provisional Statement there was no public right of way over the land;
- (b) that the rights conferred on the public at that date by the public right of way over the land were such rights as may be specified in the application, and not such rights as are indicated in the Provisional Map and Statement;
- (c) that the position or width of that part of the land over which the public right of way subsisted at the said date was as specified in the application and not as indicated in the Provisional Map and Statement; or
- (d) that the public right of way over the land at the said date was not unconditional but was subject to limitations or conditions specified in the application, or, if the said right is indicated in the Provisional Statement as being subject to limitations or conditions, that the said right was subject to other limitations or conditions, specified in the application either in addition to or in substitution for those indicated in the Provisional Statement.

A notice of application for a declaration should be addressed with the prescribed period to the Clerk of the Peace, County Hall, Wakefield, specifying the land to which the application relates, the grounds upon which the application is made, and that the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire are the Surveying Authority. A copy of the notice of application should also be served upon every other person appearing to the applicant to be the owner, lessee or occupier of the said or of any land specified in the application in regard to which the Court may make a direction, and also upon the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire addresses to the
